Coláiste Dún an Rí – Uniform Policy

Policy Statement

This Uniform Policy has been drawn up to meet the needs of Coláiste Dún an Rí and has been adopted by the Board of Management of Coláiste Dún an Rí and Cavan and ratified by Monaghan Education and Training Board.

Rationale

A uniform dress code fosters pride in appearance and helps develop a sense of pride and belonging in representing Coláiste Dún an Rí. The uniform dress code addresses issues of equality, expense and health and safety. A uniform dress code ultimately helps develop a culture of community in the school and its surrounding environment.

Aims

- To promote equality amongst all students
- To help develop in students a sense of pride in our school.
- To help develop a sense of belonging with our school.
- To provide value for money clothing that is durable and practical for a school environment.
- The enhance a positive image of our school within the wider community.

Remit of this Policy

This policy should be read in conjunction with the school Code of Behaviour and it applies to all students during school hours, while travelling to and from school and while participating in school organised activities.

The Uniform

The school uniform is as follows:

- Jade V-neck jumper with a gold stripe around the collar manufactured by Deer Park Knitwear.
- Black bootleg trousers or straight skirt with pleat in the back for girls.
- Black polyester/viscose trousers for boys.
- White shirt or blouse.
- Jade and gold clip-on tie
- Official black school coat (soft-shell style) with jade lining on the inner collar and jade stripes on the front of the jacket. This is manufactured by Deer Park Knitwear.
- Black shoes (with black soles) and black socks (or tights, 40+ Denier, for girls). Runners or canvass type shoes are not allowed.
- Jade coloured school scarves will be obtained at a later date if there is sufficient demand.
- A PE uniform will be decided in due course.

Guidelines for the School Uniform

Parents are asked to support the school in insuring that students adhere to the guidelines as detailed below:

- The school uniform must be clean, neat and correctly worn at all times.
- Shirts/blouses should be buttoned at the neck.
- Ties must be worn properly and not loosely around the collar.
- Skirts must be worn to the knee.
- Only school uniform jacket to be worn. Non-uniform jackets, fleeces or hoodies must not be worn on the way to school or during school time.
- Jewellery should be kept to a minimum and it is limited to two finger rings and one discrete earring in each ear.
- Facial piercings are not allowed in any circumstances in the interests of health and safety and uniform code.
- Students are not allowed to wear make-up in school or while representing the school.
- Students are expected to come to school with their natural hair colour.
- PE gear should not be worn to or from school or in class at any time in the interests of hygiene.
- Students are expected not to wear runners to and from school.
- Black runners or canvass type shoes are not allowed.
- It is the responsibility of students to look after their uniform at all times. To prevent loss of items parents/guardians are asked to insure that jackets and jumpers are labelled with the student's name.
- Students are expected to look neat and well-groomed while wearing the school uniform and representing the school.

Any issues relating to uniform should be brought to the attention on the principal as soon as possible.

Breaches of the uniform guidelines will be addressed under the school Code of Behaviour. Nonuniform items of clothing worn to school may be confiscated and returned when a parent/guardian collects the item from school.

Manufacturer and Suppliers of Uniform

Coláiste Dún an Rí stipulates that the school jumper and school jacket is manufactured by Deer Park Knitwear. A jumper and/or jacket not manufactured by Deer Park Knitwear will not be considered as official school uniform and parents/guardians will be asked to replace the jumper and/or journal.

The uniform jumper and jacket can be ordered from Deer Park Knitwear through dedicated uniform suppliers in Kingscourt. Other items of uniform may be purchased from these suppliers or elsewhere.
